

Project Statement

The new facility for Tri-Community South EMS is an intergovernmental cooperation project– jointly run by the Municipality of Bethel Park, Township of Upper St. Clair and Township of South Park. This full-service emergency medical response unit facility serves as the major provide within the South Hills of Pittsburgh, PA. EPM completed a feasibility study for Tri-Community South EMS, determining their current and future needs. EPM also assisted in locating a suitable property to meet their service needs.

The new 14,100 sq.ft. facility, centrally houses; 12 emergency response vehicles, operations, training and administrative facilities. Located on 2.25 acres within an industrial park, selected materials of split-faced cmu and deep-ribbed metal siding provide a maintenance-free, durable exterior.
